Infiltration of TIC in Ohio communities

Goal:

Expand opportunities for Ohioans to receive trauma-informed interventions by enhancing efforts for practitioners, facilities and agencies to become competent in trauma informed practices.

Progress to date:

- Train-the-trainer model 170 trainers available throughout the state; as of May 2017 over 10,500 have been trained in trauma-informed approaches at over 268 trainings
- Content focused on system infrastructure and infiltration

Partnership Work

Goal:

Support the implementation of trauma-informed care systems and trauma-specific services across Ohio's social services systems.

Progress to date:

- Partner with the Ohio Department of Health on their Early Childhood Comprehensive Systems (ECCS) Grant MHAS, Bureau of Children and Families: *Understanding Toxic Stress*
- Partner with Attorney General's Office VOCA (Crime Victim's Fund) programming
- Combined TIC training for ODJFS and OhioMHAS Licensure and Certification staff

- Combined OhioMHAS, DODD, Attorney General's Office, ODJFS, ODE and ODH Central Office staff training: Trauma-Informed Approach: Key Assumptions and Principles (200 staff, February 2016)
- Partner with Department of Aging to roll out *Trauma-Informed Approach: Responding to Older Adults*
- Partner with Ohio Veterans Homes to implement trauma-informed care within nursing homes and domiciliary; all staff training in October and December 2016
- Partner with Ohio Peace Officer Training Academy (OPOTA) to roll out critical subject Trauma-Informed Policing training (6 hrs.) for law enforcement basic and advanced professional development training January 2017. To date, over 1,800 law enforcement officers have participated in the six hour Trauma-Informed Policing course.
