

#### Clinical Practice Commission



- Made research-based recommendations, including a shared professional lexicon, as a foundation for effectively implementing evidence-based clinical practice.
- Described how partnerships between educator preparation providers and PK-12 can successfully create laboratories of practice for both teacher candidates and practicing teachers.
- Recommendations provide a launch point to advocate for policies needed in order for high-quality clinical practice to be successful.
  - AACTE and its Commission members are now focused on dissemination and coaching

#### Special Education Partnership with CEEDAR

Working through a grant from the Collaboration for Effective Educator Development, Accountability, and Reform (CEEDAR) Center, AACTE is:

- Developing an AACTE Special Education Task Force
  - Will develop tenets to guide inclusive clinical practice programs that prepare general and special educators to work together to meet the needs of each learner.
  - Will study areas such as dual licensure and dual preparation models, pipeline strategies for recruitment and retention, interdisciplinary collaboration, and other factors pertinent to this specialized preparation

#### Principles for Accreditation in Educator Preparation

The Board of Directors of the American Association of Colleges for Teacher Education (AACTE) reaffirms the importance of a *unified national professional accreditation system* that aligns with AACTE's Principles for National Accreditation in Educator Preparation



- THE QUALITY PRINCIPLE: Accreditation Improves the Quality of Education
- THE EVIDENCE PRINCIPLE: Accreditation Is Grounded in Evidence of Effectiveness/Graduate Quality
- THE CONSENSUS PRINCIPLE: Accreditation Reflects Consensus on Best Practices
- THE SERVICE PRINCIPLE: The Accreditation Process Is Transparent and in Service to the Profession and the Public

### Advocacy

#### AACTE National Advocacy Priorities

#### Challenges facing the profession include:

- Teacher shortages
- Declining enrollment in educator preparation programs
- Continued diversity gap between teachers and students
- Declining funding for programs that support the profession







#### Federal Advocacy Focus—Funding

### **Key programs that AACTE advocates for annually (and the legislation that authorizes the program):**

- Teacher Quality Partnership (TQP) grants (\$43.1m; HEA)
- Title II-A State grants (\$2.1b; ESSA)
- Special Education Personnel Preparation (\$84 million IDEA)
  TEACHER EDUCATION
- Institute of Education Sciences (\$613m; ESRA)

Packaging the Labor/HHS/Education spending bill with the Defense spending bill was a very clever strategy to gain votes from both Democrats and Republicans. Overall the bill funds the Department of Education at nearly \$71.5 billion, a \$581 million increase from FY 2018. Below are some key programs and their new funding levels:

#### Reauthorization of the Higher Education Act

### The PROSPER Act (H.R. 4508) <u>ELIMINATES</u> key programs that support the profession

- Teacher Quality Partnership (TQP) Grants--only federal initiative dedicated to strengthening and transforming educator preparation while meeting the workforce needs of high-need schools
- TEACH Grants--a program that supports recruitment and retention of teachers in high-need fields
- Public Service Loan Forgiveness, Loan Forgiveness for Teachers, and Loan Forgiveness in areas of National Need

#### School Safety and Net Neutrality

#### **School Safety**

- No federal funds used to train or to arm school personnel with firearms
- Fund Title IV of the Every Student Succeeds Act, which supports the social, emotional and mental health of our nation's students
- Testimony before the Federal School Safety Commission

#### **Net Neutrality**

- Maintain the net neutrality rule; critical on a personal level and for education
- The rule keeps *open access* to all legal content on the web; prevents throttling, prioritizing, & blocking of content
