

SUED Meeting Minutes January 22, 2020

Discussion Items:

There was discussion around the meeting this afternoon with select members of SUED and Tom Lasley, Kate Walsh and another representative from NCTQ. Senator Peggy Lehner will participate in this meeting also. Joe Keferl (WSU) presented proposed ground rules (attached?) for the meeting. The resounding tone of discussion with SUED members was that to participate in discussion with NCTQ may appear to others that we support them and their methods. It was clearly stated that SUED does not support NCTQ or their methods and wants to be very careful about any messaging that goes out regarding SUED's agreement in any way with NCTQ. NCTQ communicated to SUED through Tom Lasley to SUED that they would like to meet with us to know more about the functions of SUED. An invitation to Senator Lehner, the State Superintendent DeMaria and other folks from the Senate or House is to go out from us today that they are welcome to attend future standing meetings and at these they would likely understand better the inner workings of SUED.

Dawn Shinew attended a meeting with Knowledge Works about Personalized Learning as a representative of Educator Preparation. (Dawn recommends Julie McIntosh from OAPCTE attend as well as a rep of educator preparation.) Dawn will send a link to members of SUED that explains Knowledge Works and Personalized Learning. Upcoming meets are scheduled at which SUED will be represented. Conversations resulted that have led to future visits by members of the House to state IHEs.

Joe and Dawn met with Senators Cupp's and Patterson's Work Group on School Finance. Representative Carfagna, school librarians, technology directors, a representative from ODE, and others were represented.

- Qualified teachers – content and local area
- Curriculum – especially those areas in which low numbers of students are interested and Districts cannot afford teachers for these areas
